Effective Leadership

- We adhere to, and advocate for the Rights of the Child
- We value our connections with children, families and communities
- We empower team members with the knowledge and training to confidently identify and respond to all forms of child abuse and neglect
- We implement and embed clear child protection and safeguarding policies and procedures
- We employ suitable and qualified team members



Inclusive Environments



- We encourage and actively support children to express their culture and enjoy their cultural rights
- We prioritise meaningful reconciliation action
- We provide individualised adjustments and supports for children
- We have processes in place to ensure instances of racism is identified, confronted and not tolerated
- We have policies, procedures, and systems in place to create a culturally safe and inclusive environment
- We take into account children's social, cultural and linguistic diversity (including abilities, disabilities, gender, sexual identity and family circumstances)



Child Safe Culture



- We take a zero-tolerance approach to child abuse and neglect
- We prioritise the participation and empowerment of children across our centre's
- We strive to maintain child safe physical and online environments
- We respond appropriately to all child protection and safeguarding concerns
- We remain vigilant to all forms of child abuse and neglect
- We speak up if we believe or suspect that a child is at risk
